NEWS FROM THE LOWER SCHOOL

Pupils have been learning about walking safely with an adult, responding to simple instructions and expressing their likes and dislikes through their own personalised communication systems.

The trip to Whipsnade Zoo was a great success. The children came back very happy, content and exhausted from a busy day out meeting different animals and did extremely well with the hot weather.



Class 7 have had a fabulous start on our topic 'Seaside and Beaches'. We loved our opening event with Embracing Arts fantastic engagement in creative sensory experiences from 'under the sea'. We have been loving exploring sand, edible sand and water using them with tools developing our Maths and physical skills. We have enjoyed making requests for our new seaside themed songs. We have been exploring objects about the beach and using our communication skills to communicate and comment about them.
