**Class 1** have been continued to enjoy exploring our topic of transport and travel. We have been particularly enjoyed listening to the rhymes and the stories related to the theme. On the Tuesday afternoons, the students have the weekly trip and went to the coffee shop, exploring different areas of the school and socialise with other children and staff. For the Maths area, apart from counting, we have been working on one and lots concept and one to one correspondent.











Class 2 have had a fantastic fortnight exploring a wide range of media and materials. This has been in Child-Initiated play opportunities and structured learning. This has helped to develop tactile processing skills. We have also continued our trips to the Woodfield Coffee Shop and have been learning to have appropriate interactions with the wider community. We have enjoyed watching the ducklings hatch, listening to their vocalisations and having the opportunity to observe wildlife within the school.















Class 3 have settled well since being back in school after half term. We have continued exploring our topic of travel and transport. We particularly have enjoyed an interactive race track which we are able to control with switches to make the cars go fast around the track! We have started to take regular visits to our Coffee Shop in school. We have been learning about how to purchase an item of choice in the coffee shop with support of a communication aid and handling money. Many of us enjoyed tucking in to the cakes that we chose! Some of us experienced a Table Cricket session in the hall, we had lots of fun playing and taking turns with our peers. In our art session we have enjoyed making sun catchers which we have put up on our windows in class, we are all hoping for some sunshine soon!







Class 4. Welcome back from Class 4, we hope you had a wonderful half term.

Class 4 have been working really hard over the past few weeks, we have been learning to use blue strips to follow a set of directions in different sessions, the children especially enjoyed using these during cooking, we made some lovely cakes to take home to our families.

We have been learning about our emotions and how they can make us feel, the children enjoy using our working wall to put their faces in a zone to tell others how they are feeling.

As part of our PSED sessions Class 4 took their first trip to the Coffee Shop this week, hopefully the first of many. The children are learning to be in new and different spaces and were very excited by this.



Class 5. The start of this half term, Class 5 have continued to work on the theme of travel and transport in varied ways. In our continuous provision, we have been working on extending our action words in genera and on the theme of transport by moving vehicles through different materials like flour, different types of sugar and jelly. Our messy play sessions are some of our favourite parts of the week! We visited the ponies, had lots of time enjoying music in Jummy Dance, in the classroom playing musical instruments, dancing and singing along with our favourite songs, and laughing and dancing along when our favourites come up! We have taken part in a few different art projects, have made pizza & cupcakes in cooking, experienced lots of new tastes and textures in Touch & Taste.











#### NEWS FROM THE SECONDARY SCHOOL

**Class 6** have had a great couple of weeks. We have continued exploring our topic of travel and transport as well as different events such as Mother's Day and world book day. We have also had visitors to the school, 4 ducklings! Class 6 have been very interested in these and have enjoyed looking at them on their way into school. We've been getting outside a lot and have enjoyed the new basketball hoop in the playground.











Class 7. We have had a very busy start to this half term. We are continuing to enjoy learning activities as part of our continuous provision related to our travel and transport topic. We have been focusing on turn taking with our peers and adults and using our communication to interact. In Maths we have been following lists and continuing to develop our 1:1 correspondence, during these activities. One of our favourite activities in Maths has been preparing party bags using a list and counting items. We have been continuing our community access, and our highlight of the week was visiting the Library. We are very proud of Class 7 following social rules when visiting the Library, they made choices of books and engaged well sharing these with adults and putting the books when they had finished. As part of our community access we have also been learning to stop at road sides and use the pedestrian crossing. Integration sessions have been very popular and we have continued to work with different peers across class 8 and 9 and, visiting peers from Tudor school taking part in touch and taste and making smoothies together. In communication sessions we have been focusing on working on our individual communication targets about our experiences we particularly enjoyed our Ramadan themed touch and taste session.













Class 8 have had a fantast start back after the half term break. In cooking, we have made pancakes with a selection of toppings, including healthy choices such as fruit. We also made bird feeders. The children have been excited by our new fluffy duckling friends, the children have visited the ducklings as they have hatched. The children have been learning about health and hygiene, as part of our ongoing learning for independence. Each day, the children take part in a range of maths and literacy-based activities. We have been focussing on sentence building and number work these past two weeks. In art, the children have been creating different colours and textures to create the sea and recreating sail boats as part of our transport and travel topic. We look forward to putting these sail boats into frames within the classroom, when they are completed.



**Class 9** have been busy working on their big art project, where each week a big new piece is added to help bring the student's work to life. This is something all the pupils work on and really enjoy. We have also been busy with some spring crafts looking at special celebrations like mothers day.

In phonics we have been looking at letter recognition and hiding letter around the classroom and our school area and matching them to our letter line in class.

Finally class 9 would like to wish their adults a Happy Mothers day and we hope you like the surprises that should be coming home on Friday.







Class 10. In class 10 we have really enjoyed our new book: Mrs Armitage on wheels. At the end of the book, Mrs Armitage's bike crashes and is destroyed and needs taking to the dump. Unfortunately, Mrs Armitage's bike is too big to fit into the boot of her car! So Class 10 have come to the rescue! We have learnt all about how a bike is fixed together with screws and bolts. We learnt about allen keys and shifting spanners and used these to remove the screws and bolts from the bike. We also used our fine motor skills to play turn taking games using the wheels and tongs to grab items through the spokes one after the other. This really helped us to increase our hand grip strength and our precision when using our hands for activities.

We were also lucky enough to have a session with a visiting table cricket group in the hall which was a big success and very enjoyable.



Class 11 had a fantastic week with learning new things in maths, using different ingredients. Class 11 welcomed the newborn baby ducklings! We explained to class 11 on how the ducklings were born and the process of it. They also watched a video of the ducklings being born! We decorated pictures of ducks using different coloured tissue paper as a welcoming to Woodfield. Students in class 11 discovered and participated in table cricket and competing with their peers. Great fun was had! We have been doing lots of transitioning around school, socialising with peers in different classes. We had a visit from the music therapist and enjoyed a lovey music session using various instruments and exploring different sounds of each instrument used.



Class 12 have had a good two weeks and have been very busy with lots of activities. The class have been practicing their turn taking and social skills with games such as snakes and ladders and connect four. Last week they loved making Welsh cakes to celebrate St David's day. They used aided language boards to communicate to staff what ingredients and equipment they needed next. This week the class have been talking about how special their mums all are and making water bottle flowers and cards for gifts. We really hope all mums enjoy receiving them and have a nice weekend celebrating with your children and the rest of your families.













**Class 14** have been learning to cope with and accept change, we have been working on getting to know each other and welcoming new staff. Saracens have been in to get us moving and of course Jummy has been in to get our blood pumping! We continue our hard work in the coffee shop as always.


